"Together." is the theme of the three-day 113th AFR Convention scheduled February 16-18, 2018 at the Embassy Suites Hotel & Conference Center, 2501 Conference Drive in Norman. All activities will be in the conference center. Registration and voting will open on Friday morning with the first General Session at 1 p.m. The convention will adjourn at the end of the worship service Sunday morning. We are grateful for returning top tier sponsors *Willis Re, Oklahoma Ag Credit, Farm Credit of Western Oklahoma and BancFirst*.

TICKETING:

Tickets for the Agent Lunch, Women's Lunch, Reception and Convention Banquet will be presold/reserved and may be charged to your County, Local or Agency, or paid by cash or check. Paying by credit card is not an option. Pre-registration is required for these events whether complimentary or not. Tickets will be packaged and available for pick-up in Boomer A after 9 a.m. February 16. OPENING SESSION:

BANQUET:

The Banquet begins at 7:00 p.m., Saturday, February 17, in the Oklahoma Ballroom. Pre-seating is available at 6:45 p.m. Entertainment is by AFR's own Melody Schaffer. AFR member and Senior AFR/OFU State Speech Contest winner Kabrin Martin, Harrah FFA delivers a message of "Stand for Something". Banquet tickets are only \$31.50 (thanks to the *Oklahoma Pork Council entrée sponsorship*) and must be purchased in advance. There will be limited reserve seating for a few guests and VIPs with open seating for all other ticket holders and guests. BancFirst Board Chairman H.E. "Gene" Rainbolt and his team bring remarks and even a bit of entertainment along with a drawing for Thunder tickets. The banquet is being shortened this time without a hired entertainer for the event but instead provide for a relaxing evening.

2018 COUNTY LEADERSHIP ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS:

Outstanding County Organizations will be recognized at the banquet on Saturday evening. County Leadership Awards are based on four key areas: A) Involvement of Local and County Leadership in activities B) Promotion and Support of AFR Policy Positions C) Participation in the AFR Youth and Adult Education Programs and D) Implementation of new ways to support AFR improving Rural and Community Life in Oklahoma. The goal is to award local and county organizations for creating initiatives for members to become more involved. A formal
